

# Frequently Asked Questions

## **How do I apply?**

Complete the admissions application. Admissions applications can be filled out online [here](#) or by paper application submitted to the Admissions office. Paper applications may be picked up in person or by mail upon request.

## **Do I have to live on campus?**

CMN does not require their students to live on campus. However, students that live more than 50 miles from campus and are under the age of 21 years are encouraged to live on campus.

## **What if I am not a U.S. Citizen?**

In accordance with Title 70, O.S., Section 3242 (2007), an individual who cannot present the institution valid documentation of United States nationality or an immigration status permitting study at a postsecondary institution, but who has graduated from a public or private high school in Oklahoma, may be eligible for enrollment and resident tuition. The individual must provide the same documentation as a domestic student and is required to file an affidavit of intent with the institution. ## **I received an acceptance letter, what do I need to do next?**

Once you have been accepted as a student, your next step is to make sure all Admissions documents have been turned in and accepted. After confirmation of completion of all documents, you may meet with your Advisor to enroll for classes.

## **How do I register or enroll in classes?**

Once all of your admissions documents have been received your admissions process is complete and you may register/enroll in classes. All students will need to see an Advisor to enroll. First-time students will be advised through the Student Success Center for the first two trimesters. All other students will enroll through their program advisor.

## **Who is my program/academic advisor?**

Your program/academic advisor is assigned according to the academic program you have chosen. To find out who your advisor is, log into your Student Portal and view advisors on your home page. If you are a first time student: your advisement will take place in the Student Success Center for the first two trimesters.

**I am struggling in class; does CMN have tutoring services available?**

CMN cares deeply about your success as a student, therefore the college offers tutoring services at no cost to the student. Visit the Student Success Center, Learning Center, Library, or campus bulletin boards for tutoring times.

**Where do I get my student ID and is it required?**

Your student ID is obtained at the front desk in the Administration building. A student ID is required for all students. This ID card is used for campus services, including purchasing books and meal plans. The first ID is issued free of charge during enrollment, replacement IDs are \$10.

**Do I need a parking permit?**

Student vehicles are required to display a valid parking decal. These decals may be obtained from the Bursars office in the Administration building.

**What if I did not graduate high school?**

If you are a non-high school graduate, you are still eligible to enroll at CMN. However, this may have an impact on your financial aid. Speak with our Financial Aid and Scholarships office for more information.

If you have a High School Equivalency, we will need an official transcript of your GED, HiSET, or TASC scores.

**What is the Accuplacer placement test?**

This is a self-paced computerized assessment of your Reading, Math, and English skills. The Accuplacer assessment can be taken locally weekdays between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Off-campus testing may be arranged by contacting testing centers in your area to see if they offer the testing; however, please be aware that you may have to pay a fee to test at another facility. **Do I have to take the Accuplacer placement test?**

You may be required to participate in the Accuplacer assessment if each of the sub-scores on your ACT is below 19.
